Google Forms

- Use self-scoring quizzes that include branching, videos.
- Forms show results in a detailed responses page, or can be linked to an online spreadsheet
- Pre-built templates can get you started quickly.



Google Slides

- This online version of PowerPoint eliminates the need for attachments and multiple versions of a document. Share editing permissions with other authors and editor.
- Use presentation tools to host an audience Q&A and more!
- Enable comments to work with a larger team
- Publish slides to the web without any need for FTP access or embed in a live web page. Your slides will update automatically as you make changes.
- The slides can be viewed and/or edited on any mobile device. mLearning couldn't be easier. (link to a Google Form for a quiz at the end)

YouTube

- If you have a gmail account, you have a Youtube Channel.
- Use Youtube Studio to edit video settings, thumbnails, playlists, end screens that link to other videos... even edit the video itself.
- Keep videos private by sharing with a select group or upload as "unlisted" then share the link. It will be available for anyone with the link.
- Playlists can be unlisted, too.
- Recent changes make live-streaming an event directly to Youtube much much much easier.
- Or Live stream using Google Hangouts if you'd like to screenshare.

Google Sites

- This modern web authoring tool allows you to make a responsive website in minutes.
- Content and formatting will adjust so you can view on tablet, smart phone, or PC
- Whip up a site in minutes. Embed forms, slides, docs, videos, and more!

Google Classroom

- Have a stream of activity during a learning session.
- Share details of assignments along with links to documents and other resources.
- Assign Teachers and Students or share links to allow self-registration
